Neil Weinberg is an Executive Editor at Forbes Media in New York. He is in charge of personal finance coverage for Forbes magazine and Forbes.com. His editorial duties also include overseeing investigative reporting for the magazine and managing a staff of nine editors and reporters.

Prior to his appointment as personal finance editor in May 2008, Weinberg worked as an investigative reporter for Forbes magazine. His stories focused on controversial practices in business and politics. Over the past few years he has profiled corporate, mutual fund and pension scandals, excesses in executive pay, the pending collapse of private equity and hedge funds and the dark side of whistleblowing.

A sixteen-year Forbes veteran, Weinberg served as the magazine's Tokyo bureau chief from 1995 to 1998 and has reported extensively abroad. He received the Overseas Press Club's 2006 annual award for the best business story in a magazine.

With Walter Pavlo, Jr., Weinberg co-authored *Stolen Without A Gun: Confessions from inside history's biggest accounting fraud—the collapse of MCI WorldCom* (Etika Books, 2007). The book combines the immediacy of autobiography with the perspective of an investigative journalist to profile Pavlo's journey from rising corporate star to convicted white-collar felon. A number of universities are currently using the book and an Instructor's Guide the authors published to teach business ethics, accounting and related subjects.

Weinberg frequently gives speeches to universities on the book, business ethics and the recent financial meltdown. He is also a frequent commentator on CNBC, Fox News and other networks, as well as a regular cast member on the Fox News program *Forbes on Fox*. He holds an MBA from the American Graduate School of International Management and a Bachelor's Degree in English Literature from the College of William and Mary in Virginia.
